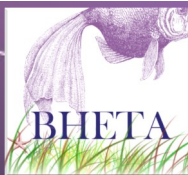

SFBT Overview

Tuesday, September 13, 2016 from 8:30 AM - 12:30 PM

This half-day workshop will provide an overview to the SFBT approach, highlight points of contrast with more traditional approaches, and review research supporting the efficacy of SFBT with children and their families.

- Identify the principles of SFBT
- Discuss current research
- List benefits and limitations of SFBT
- Describe how this practice supports cultural competence and resiliency

SFBT Skills

Tuesday, September 20, 2016 from 8:30 AM - 4:30 PM & Tuesday, October 4, 2016 from 8:30 AM- 12:30 PM

Prerequisite: Completion of SFBT Overview

This 1 ½ day skill development training will provide practical training using video demonstrations, vignettes, and interactive role plays. Participants will practice core SFBT skills and apply them to common problems.

Upon completion of this training, participants will be able to:

- Accurately assess if SFBT is a relevant/indicated intervention
- Demonstrate appropriate application of SFBT techniques with children, youth, and families
- Apply SFBT principles and methods across cultures
- Describe how to tailor techniques to meet the individual needs of children, youth, and families

Prerequisite: Completion of SFBT Overview and Skills Training

The case conference will provide participants an opportunity to hone their acquired SFBT skills. Participants will present cases for discussion. Here you will have the opportunity to discuss challenges and successes in providing SFBT. Discussions will lead to deepening your skills and overcoming difficult situations.

- Address common stumbling blocks/challenges
- Tailor interactions to meet the needs of the clients where they are
- Incorporate solution focused language in treatment plans
