The San Diego County Pathways to Well-Being Child and Family Team (CFT) Facilitation trainings are taught in a triad with a representative from Child Welfare Services, Behavioral Health Services and the family/youth sector. CFT Facilitation trainings are geared towards Behavioral Health professionals who will be facilitating Child and Family Team meetings and are an opportunity to strengthen facilitation skills while learning the necessary components of the CFT meeting.

Upon completion of this training, participants will be able to:

- Explain the components of a Child and Family Team meeting
- Prepare for a CFT meeting
- Practice effective facilitation skills that support safety, permanency and well-being
- Demonstrate effective use of solution focused inquiry
- Demonstrate the incorporation of cultural factors in facilitation
- Navigate disagreement and facilitate challenging conversations
