Course Description: Motivational Interviewing (MI) is a client-centered, directive method for enhancing intrinsic motivation to change by exploring and resolving ambivalence. It is an evidence-based technique that is a collaborative, respectful, and guiding process of interaction with families and clients. This is a process that focuses on resiliency and strengths. In this two session, 11-hour training, participants will learn the foundations of Motivational Interviewing and practice MI techniques.

Please note the skills sessions are population specific. Service providers will be enrolled in the skills session that matches the population their programs serve.

Learning Objectives: Upon completion of this training, participants will be able to:

- Explain the principles and foundation of Motivational Interviewing
- Identify benefits of using MI with clients
- Apply MI principles and techniques in treatment
- Integrate MI techniques into current practice

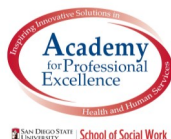
