COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The County of San Diego Behavioral Health Services along with the Juvenile Probation, OPTUM TERM, and BHETA will present a training on the "Treating the Unique Characteristics of Justice Involved Youth: Trauma, Criminogenic Needs and Mental Health Targets". This training is designed for psychologists, psychiatrists, and mental health therapists who are TERM providers or wish to become providers.

This ½ day training will provide insight on how working with justice involved youth is different than working with non-justice involved youth. This training will identify the unique treatment targets that providers must address in order to achieve both the Public Safety goals of reduced recidivism and violence and the Public Health goals of decreased psychiatric risk, symptom reduction, and increased functioning when working with Justice Involved Youth.
