COURSE DESCRIPTION:

With the legalization of recreational marijuana and the popular public opinion that it is not that dangerous, there are a number of conflicting views around marijuana use. Marijuana is increasingly common among transitional aged youth (TAY), a group most vulnerable to the biological effects of continued use. This half-day training will discuss the epidemiology and impact of marijuana use for TAY, and provide techniques for reducing marijuana use.
