

# Complex Parent-Child Interactions

## COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Some young children in early childhood (ages 0-5) face challenges in a variety of domains, such as medical, developmental, mental health, and family stress. If these difficulties persist for some time, the parent-child relationships can take on characteristics that do not support growth and maturation. Sometimes the parent's difficulties can contribute to the child's problems, or the severity of the child's problems overwhelm the parent's ability to cope. This training will address each of these situations and also discuss the challenges which may arise for the therapist when/if the parent's goals, the child's goals, and the therapist's goals do not align
