COURSE DESCRIPTION

Education is a critical pathway out of homelessness. Recent research found that youth who do not complete a high school diploma or GED are 4.5 more times likely to experience homelessness in the future. Not only can education provide a pathway out of homelessness and to stable employment, but schools are also a source of caring adults, stability, and support for students who are suffering or have suffered traumatic experiences. This training will provide information on how to identify students experiencing homelessness; the impacts of homelessness on education; and strategies to support the success of these students.
