**Dr. Marian Liu** is an Associate Professor at Purdue University. She conducts applied and translational research around elder justice issues. She has been working with Adult Protective Services since 2015, when she was at University of California, San Francisco. Her first APS project was to assist the California Department of Social Services to evaluate the needs for a statewide data system. Then she partnered with San Francisco and Napa APS to measure effective services and outcomes using standardized measures. Though she moved away in 2018, she is grateful for ongoing collaboration with California APS friends over the years.



**Rebecca Parks** is an independent consultant and board-certified Adult Nurse Practitioner specializing in geriatrics, gerontology, and the care of older adult veterans. Most recently, Rebecca managed the federally funded project of the Evaluation Team for the National Adult Protective Services Training Center (NATC), overseeing national efforts to assess APS training, recruitment, and retention strategies.
